
Please contact us and one of our volunteers will be happy to retrieve it (Provided its in the Edmonton area). We will offer a tax receipt for the market value of such items.

Affordable Housing Needs

Lower income seniors face a constant challenge to find affordable housing on their limited retirement incomes. The Bosco Foundation has accepted the challenge of spearheading the development of an apartment complex on the 3.5 acre parcel of land surrounding our St. Francis Center. We have entered into an agreement with a Service Organization to partner in operating the planned V shaped 6 story Apartment Building with 100 affordable rental suites (mostly 1 bedroom with a sprinkling of 2 bedroom units) and plenty of common areas on each floor.

- Together with the Bosco Foundation, we are now a collection of 16 not-for-profit and charitable organizations serving hundreds of clients on a weekly basis.



Many of our friends help us in various ways. Some help us financially, others make in-kind donations or volunteer their skills.

Revenue Canada allows us to issue tax deductible receipts for monetary or in-kind donations such as items which have a monetary value.



Aeroplan established a charitable vehicle for individuals to donate Aeroplan Miles. Pooling Aeroplan Miles in support of local charitable initiatives.

You can go to the AeroPlan web-site <https://www.aeroplan.com/login/auth.do#/>, click on the Donate Miles link and transfer from your Aeroplan account a minimum of 1,000 miles or more to the St John Bosco Child and Family Services Foundation.

Sometimes one of our benefactors offers their property as an auction item for a week or two in Arizona or California and we can provide transportation by utilizing our AeroPlan Miles.

We also use our AeroPlan Miles for staff development to attend workshops or conferences, thus saving our scarce resources for charitable work.
