Summary of Dr Rozycki's Background

Living for 15 years in refugee camps of war torn Europe had a profound impact on Dr Rozycki's outlook on life:

- Growing up without a home or possessions, he learned that all his family had was each other.
- Learned that people are really not that different, regardless of race, color or creed
- Learned that cooperation was required to rebuild not only communities, but entire countries.
- It was here he met one of his role models, Father Kubica, who was the parish
 priest for almost all of his refugee years. This priest who never seemed to tire,
 always smiled and was never too busy to help, gave him frequent
 encouragement by saying, "Anything can be done, if we stop and care for one
 another."
